NOTES

¹ The Serbian Cyrillic lowercase italic Д may sometimes be seen as *g*. There is no specific Unicode encoding for this variant form so a comparable character has been

used here for illustrative purposes.

² The digraph dj(Dj) will occasionally be found as an alternative form of đ(Đ).

³ The Serbian Cyrillic lowercase italic П may sometimes be seen as *ū*. There is no specific Unicode encoding for this variant form so a comparable character has been used here for illustrative purposes.

⁴ The Serbian Cyrillic lowercase italic Т may sometimes be seen as *ū̄*. There is no specific Unicode encoding for this variant form so a comparable character has been used here for illustrative purposes.

⁵ An inventory of letter-diacritic combinations, with their Unicode encoding, in addition to the unmodified letters of the basic Roman script is:

Đ (U+0110)	đ (U+0111)
Ž (U+017D)	ž (U+017E)
Lj (U+01C8)*	lj (U+01C9)*
Ć (U+0106)	ć (U+0107)
Dž (U+01C5)*	dž (U+01C6)*
